Hirohito transfusion is cut short

TOKYO (Reuters)—Doctors cut short a second blood transfusion yesterday for Japan's ailing Emperor Hirohito for fear it was putting too great a strain on his heart, palace officials said.

The 87-year-old emperor, who fell ill on Sept. 19 and has been suffering from internal bleeding, received 115 cc. of blood before doctors discontinued the transfusion because his pulse rate began to rise dangerously high, officials said.

Earlier in the day he had received a 200-cc. transfusion.

Hirohito's pulse then rose to what doctors described as the equivalent of a jogger's heartbeat. His doctors attributed the rapid pulse to the transfusion.

"The doctors are doing their best to treat His Majesty," a palace spokesman said. The emperor's racing pulse was caused by the transfusion, he added.

Court doctors have so far given Hirohito about 11.5 pints of blood.

Reporters asked whether Hirohito was getting enough nutrition. He has not taken food since Saturday, when he sipped a few spoonfuls of soup.

"We've been giving him the calories he needs," said the palace spokesman. He did not elaborate.

Attendants washed the emperor's hair on Tuesday and early yesterday. "He said it made him feel better," the spokesman said.

Prime Minister Noboru Takeshita visited Crown Prince Akihito yesterday, their first meeting since Hirohito collapsed.

Takeshita's aides said the prime minister conveyed his concern over the emperor's health, Kyodo news agency reported.

The prime minister has not been granted an audience with the emperor since he fell ill. Visits have been limited to family members.

In Seoul, a government source said South Korean President Roh Tae-woo was likely to postpone a planned visit to Japan next month because of Hirohito's poor health.

Fans 'rebel' at Christian rock concert

BISMARCK, N.D. (AP)—A throng of teenagers at a Christian rock show broke a barricade as they pushed their way toward the stage after promoters announced the show's opening act would not perform, witnesses said.

A barricade made of scaffolding and plywood gave way under the rush of fans at the Tuesday night concert by Stryper, a nationally known group that bills itself as a Christian heavy metal rock band.

After the problem with the opening act was announced, Stryper's performance as the main act was delayed for an hour.

No injuries were reported. A small fire broke out when some electrical wiring was trampled, according to officials and witnesses. It was extinguished without incident.

The barricade, which was intended to separate spectators from the stage, was removed when it became structurally unsound, said Paul Johnson, manager of the Bismarck Civic Center. Johnson estimated the crowd at 3,350.

"As soon as the barricade started to bend, the concert stopped and we assessed the situation," said Johnson.

One of the concertgoers said the rush of fans toward the stage was caused by the announcement that the opening act, White Lion, would not appear.

"Everyone was ticked," said Missy Stainaker, who suffered bruises on her ribs.

White Lion backed out of the concert and was replaced by a regional band because White Lion's lead singer had lost his voice, said Johnson. "They didn't come to see a backup for a backup," Johnson said.

Four police officers were on duty at the concert and Johnson said there was ample security for the event.

Crack suspect faces charges

An 18-year-old Orange man has been arrested on charges of possessing and trafficking 57 vials of crack, the potent cocaine derivative, near a school.

Orange Police Director Charles Cobbett identified the suspect as Du-shonte McCoy of North Essex Avenue.

McCoy was arrested at McChesney and Langdon streets Tuesday night by members of the police vice squad, Cobbett said.

After receiving complaints about drug trafficking at that location, the police placed an undercover unit there, he explained.

The result of that undercover surveillance, Cobbett noted, was McCoy's arrest and his being charged with possession of illegal drugs with an estimated street value of \$1,140, possession of illegal drugs with the intent to distribute and selling illegal drugs within 1,000 feet of a school.

He said McCoy was placed in the Orange jail, pending a municipal court arraignment today.
